A Request for Quotes (RFQ) was issued to six companies on December 14, 2021, for the services of qualified and independent certified public accounting firm with extensive experience in governmental auditing and reporting to conduct audits of MCT's financial statements, including the required opinion letters for the Illinois Downstate Operating Assistance Schedule, Illinois Consolidated Year End Financial Report, and FTA National Transit Database report.

The contract will be for a base term of three (3) audit years beginning upon contract award for the FY2022 audit through the FY2024 audit (approx. November 30, 2024 or until all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled whichever occurs first), plus two 1-year options. The option years will be automatic unless the Owner advises the Contractor of their intent not to renew by November 15 of the prevailing contract term.

Proposals were received from three firms. All proposals were deemed responsive.

The evaluation team for this project consisted of three scoring members. The evaluation team reviewed the responsive proposals taking into consideration each proposer's qualifications, experience, personnel assigned, approach, and budget/cost. The budget established for the services in any awarded contract is \$45,000 annually. An additional \$10,000 is budgeted for optional work which may be requested, but not required, such as auditing services required by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources for bikeway project grants.

Fees paid over the last three audit years were: FY19 \$32,910; FY20 \$34,470; and FY21 \$35,550.

Proposers submitted fully loaded hourly rates for pre-determined labor categories. These hourly rates were compared to fee schedules from information available regarding current market costs for comparable services. The hourly rates proposed by all three proposers were deemed fair and reasonable. All proposers received the maximum score of 20 points for pricing which is included in the Final Score above.
