Market Update (as of 8/31/2022)

- The economy has decelerated for two quarters in a row. Gross domestic product decreased 0.6% in the second quarter of 2022 after falling 1.6% in the first quarter. A portion of the second-quarter downturn is attributable to sectors impacted by higher interest rates that are cutting into demand (e.g., housing, nonresidential fixed investment), while rising inflation and ongoing supply-chain disruptions are impacting production. Consumer spending, which makes up nearly 70% of US economic activity, rose 1.5% in the second quarter after increasing 1.8% in the first quarter. Most of the increase in consumer spending is attributable to a 3.6% jump in services, while spending on durables slid 0.1%.
- Employment rose by 528,000 in July, well above the revised June total of 398,000 and exceeding the prior four-month average (388,000). Job growth was widespread in July, led by gains in professional and business services, leisure and hospitality, and health care. With the July increase, employment has increased by 22.0 million since reaching a low in April 2020 and has returned to its pre-pandemic level of February 2020.
- Overall, inflationary pressures weakened in July. According to the latest Personal Income and Outlays report, the personal consumption expenditures price index, a measure of inflation favored by the Federal Reserve, fell 0.1% in July after increasing 1.0% the previous month. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) was unchanged in July after climbing 1.3% in the previous month. For the 12 months ended in July, the CPI increased 8.5% (9.1% for the 12-month period ended in June). The markets will continue to focus on the inflationary outlook in the hopes that inflation peaked earlier this year.

Economic Data

Market Update (as of 8/31/2022)

- The July rally was short lived as markets reversed course in August. Investor focus turned back to the Federal Reserve and trying to predict interest rate policy and the impact it will have on economic growth. It now appears the Fed is aiming for a "growth recession", which is a period of growth slow enough to lower inflation, while still avoiding a recession. Chairman Powell's job has been made a little easier by falling oil prices and a slowing housing market. However, the labor market remains extremely tight, continuing to put upward pressure on wages.
- The August reversal occurred within markets as well as growth stocks once again underperformed after outperforming last month. Technology stocks had a rough month, falling just over 5%. Despite oil prices declining for a 3rd straight month, the energy sector came out on top, leading all other sectors for the month. US oil and natural gas reserves remain below their 5-year averages, which should bode well for future demand.
- International developed markets fell alongside the US markets, while emerging markets were basically flat for the 2nd month in a row. Similar to the southwestern US, China is dealing with their own drought that has forced them to reduce power supplies as the country's hydroelectric capacity has been impacted. This is on top of the COVID lockdowns still being implemented as part of their "zero COVID" policy. Europe had some good news regarding their energy struggles. They've reached their gas storage goals ahead of schedule as conservation programs helped ease supply constraints from Russia.

Fixed Income Recap

- At the annual Economic Policy Symposium in Jackson Hole on August 31st, Fed Chairman Jay Powell took the opportunity to reinforce the need for higher interest rates, acknowledging that there would be "some pain to households and businesses" and that they would "keep at it until the job is done."
- Not surprisingly, Treasury bond yields rose across the curve. The 2-year US Treasury note yield rose from 3.36% prior to his speech to 3.49% at month-end and the 10-year yield rose from 3.03% to 3.19%. Fed Funds Futures rose as well, forecasting a Fed Funds rate of nearly 4% by early next year, indicating another 1.5% of rate increases over the next 7 months.
- The Fed is willing to raise rates to the point of pushing the economy into recession, if necessary, in order to get inflation down to its 2% target. Unfortunately, we think that a recession will be necessary to lower inflation, which will start next year. Consequently, we expect bond yields to grind higher in the coming months, giving bond investors the best yields in over a decade.

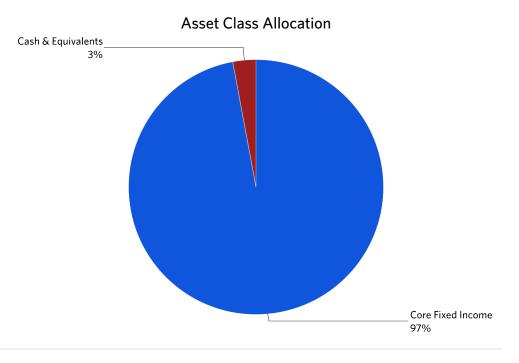

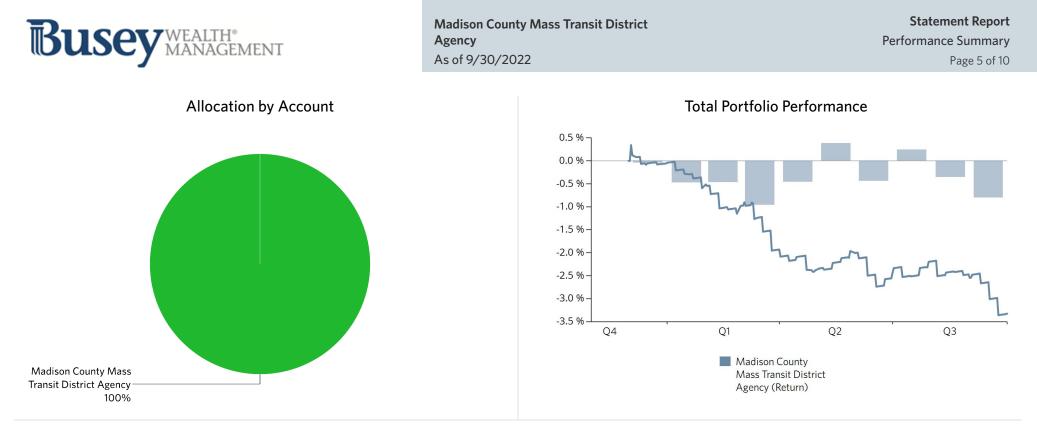


Net Additions and Market Value

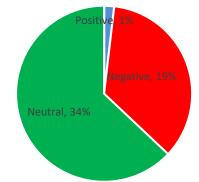

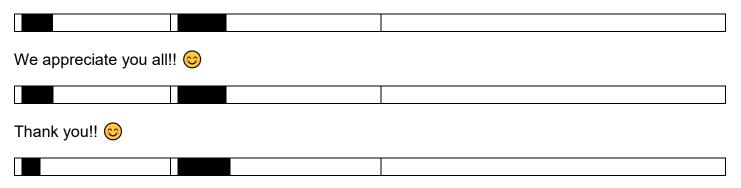

To MCT, I understand the need to cut services due to lack of participation. I never think any bus line or train line should have less service because it does not help getting new riders and that's a fact. I use the 18X everyday to get back and forth from work and it's great every 30 mins (due to having to work late or go in a little early). But like most riders, I use it for work and that means for most during rush hour, and perhaps a compromise can be made instead cutting service across the board (example: cutting service for every hour instead of 30 mins), why not keep the existing service from 7am to 9am and 3PM to 5PM and the rest of the time be every hour. So a bus would leave Collinsville station around 5:58 am then the next 6:58 am then 7:28 am, 7:58 am, 8:28 am, 8:58 then 9:58...and similarly with rush hour times back...with those 2 hours having 4 buses rather than 2 for the rest of the day. Collinsville doesn't have a good means of public transport without the 18X and cutting service to the extreme would lose ridership. Please keep rush hour service the same, then figure out the rest from there.

Our daughter frequently rides the #4 Madison-Edwardsville MCT bus from Granite City to SIUE to attend classes. With the proposed changes effective in January, it does not make sense for the MCT bus to arrive at the SIUE campus a few minutes after the hour as <u>all</u> of the classes start on the hour and there needs to be some time to walk to the various buildings. It would make a lot more sense to have the buses arrive at the half hour so there is ample time for walking and getting to class.

I hope you will please consider this change for <u>all</u> students.

Hello, I am an essential worker who my family and I are still depending on the bus for the past 37 years. I do not own a vehicle and this is my only way to get to work. I am not a doctor or nurse but I work on the docks to make sure hospital supplies are delivered promptly so that patients can get the care that they need. My job doesn't get much prestige but without it, the hospital would not function efficiently. Please do not remove the 5:02am time from the Collinsville #18 route as my day at the hospital starts early. I have been a resident in Collinsville, II for 18 years and catch the bus Monday-Friday monthly. I also appreciate every bus driver that has driven me back and forth to the metrolink safely and treating me with dignity and respect especially during this pandemic. Please sincerely consider my request and thank you for all you do!

Good evening,

I have some questions and comments about the proposed changes to the #7 route. The #7 bus is very convenient, the way that it currently runs--so, if it is at all possible--can you keep #7 trips at every 1/2-hour? It already did lose the last 3 trips out of Edwardsville Station, and the last 4 trips from Alton Square, back in early 2020, when it used to run later in the evenings.

If there is no way to continue running it **every** 1/2-hour, can there be 1/2-hour #7 busses for just part(s) of the day? Maybe in the afternoons, to keep the 2 trips that go through SIUE. Or, maybe a couple runs in the mornings and a couple in the afternoons--during whichever times of the day that are generally the busiest.

Or if it definitely needs to be reduced down to just hourly service, can the times be changed--so that it would leave Edw Sta and Alton Square on the :48s, instead of on the :18s? Otherwise, the #7 would never match up w/ the #12 bus, nor w/ the #16 bus. It is actually not so bad for those 2, b/c at least people can wait for them at the stations. But the #7 also would never match the #9 at the Centerstone/CVS/Walgreens stops, where there aren't any bus shelters/places to sit for the long waits.

An alternate idea (specific just to connections between the #7 and the #9) would be to switch the #9 busses back to leaving on the :48s from Alton Square and Alton Station. That's the schedule that the weekday #9 bus ran on for years until just recently. Is it possible that the #9 can go back to this schedule for weekdays? That way, if the #7 bus does have to lose its 1/2-hour trips, there still could be timely connections w/ the #9 at Centerstone/CVS/Walgreens.

Maybe it is possible to keep the #7 schedule as-is temporarily, until slight time changes to other connecting bus routes can also be planned/proposed. Possibly so that most routes can have 15-minute waits everywhere, instead of some w/ no waits and others w/ waits of 30 minutes+ ...

I do appreciate your time and consideration in these matters.

I am a regular passenger of MCT 22 University Shuttle. However, post covid and resumption of in person classes, there are a lot of students who depend on MCT 22 university shuttle for regular commute. 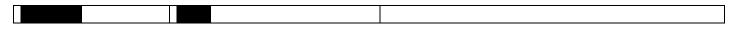
Re: Need for Bus 22 to commute from Axis to Peck in the Summer
